

ON THE COVER: The Ghost Car. In 1939, for the New York World's Fair, Pontiac took a Deluxe Six four door sedan and transformed it for their GM Futurama display. Some parts were copper plated and some like the dashboard, were chrome plated. All gaskets, running boards, floor mats and tires were made in white rubber. To top it all off was a totally exterior made of crystal-clear acrylic. The vehicle was upgraded to reflect the 1940 model for the second year of the Fair.

It is well document that after the Fair it then toured Pontiac dealers, then was loaned to the Smithsonian Institution until 1947. The car then passed through more car dealers and then into private hands. In 2011 it was sold for \$308,000 at auction to a private buyer with only 86 miles on the odometer. The seller hoped it would have been purchased by GM for their Heritage Center, but no. According to the article it has not been on display since then.

Since there were two 1939-1940 World's Fairs, New York & San Francisco, Pontiac made two of these cars. The west coast vehicle was a Torpedo Eight chassis. This vehicle toured Pontiac dealerships after the Treasure Island in San Francisco Bay Fair as well, but it is not known what happened to this car.

Chef Sue "dipped" into her stash of recipes for this one! Thanks, Sue. Spinach & Artichoke dip

1 stick of butter (not margarine)

- 1 c. chopped onion
- 1 can artichokes (14-16 oz) chopped
- 8 oz cream cheese

20 oz frozen chopped spinach 8 oz sour cream 1 c. mozzarella 1 c Parmesan cheese hot sauce

Melt butter over med heat. Add onion & cook 2 minutes. Add artichokes and a splash of artichoke juice from the can, cream cheese, sour cream, spinach and 3/4 c. each of the parmesan and mozzarella cheese and cook until warmed through. Cover top of dip with hot sauce. Transfer to oven container, sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for about 10 minutes, until cheese is melted.






