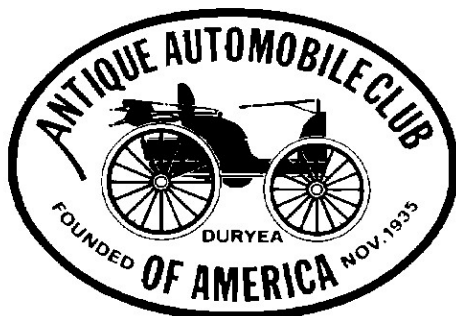

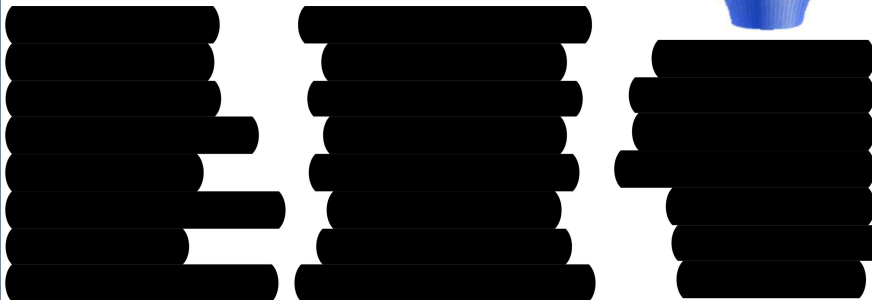

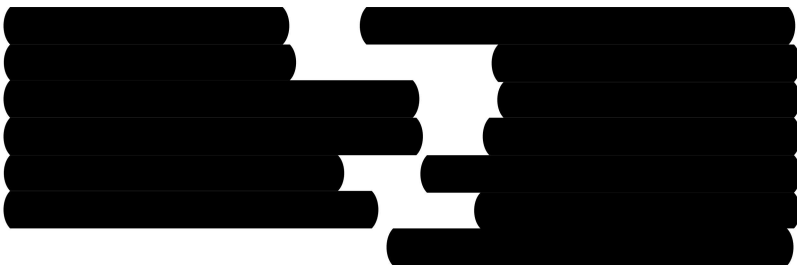

Dave Phillips and his late wife Janet started collecting Coca-Cola memorabilia in 2012. In little more than a decade, their collection now fills their entire barn. You will be amazed by the collection of Coca-Cola memorabilia the Phillip's family has collected, and is displayed, that paved the way for Coca-Cola to be a globally recognized brand. Visited and reported on by all the local TV stations, here you will get to re-visit some of the most historic items, including the original distinct script, iconic Contour bottle, Coca-Cola Polar Bear, Santa Claus, and famous taglines used throughout the years! Come check out all the critical pieces that led this Iconic brand to where it is today!

Originally marketed as a temperance drink and intended as a patent medicine, Coca-Cola was invented in the late 19th century by John Stith Pemberton in Atlanta, Georgia. In 1888, Pemberton sold the ownership rights to Asa Griggs Candler, a businessman, whose marketing tactics led Coca-Cola to its dominance of the global soft-drink market throughout the 20th and 21st century. The name refers to two of its original ingredients: coca leaves and kola nuts (a source of caffeine). The current formula of Coca-Cola remains a trade secret. The secrecy around the formula has been used by Coca-Cola in its marketing as only a handful of anonymous employees know the formula.



ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

Chevron Doctrine: Update First we must understand the Law is the Law. The Chevron Doctrine allowed federal agencies like the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency), NHTSA (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration) among others to fill in ambiguous points in law with rulings which when used in a court decision is referred as the Chevron Deference which allowed the court to defer to a recognized agency rules as matter-of-fact expert in deciding cases.

A simple hypothetical example of this would be as follows: Congress passes a law that passenger automobiles must be painted. The EPA decided that the law was ambiguous and established a rule that automobiles should be painted Black (sounds like Model T Fords, but I jest) because Black was the only color environmentally safe. Next a car maker wants to paint a car Orange, but that is against the Law. The car maker then goes to court and petitions the court to allow them to paint their car Orange. The judge hears the case and rules against the car maker using the EPA rule as the matter-of-fact expert in the case since the original law was not clear.

The overturning of the Chevron Doctrine will undoubtedly result in the following:

1. Return power to the court and judges.
2. EV – ICE mandate will be back in court
3. CARB (California Air Resources Board / EPA Compliance to emissions std. may stall.
4. It may also result in breakdown of CA. vs other 49 states adherence
5. The 16 states not following CA emission may be the start of additional states moving away from ICE BAN.
6. Behind the scenes effects will most likely be felt in the Trucking/Train and Transportation of hazardous materials.

ICE BAN: SEMA and PRI's (Principles for Responsible Investment) "friend of the court" brief, filed

August 7th with the US Supreme Court to oppose California's ICE ban, has generated attention from high-profile media outlets for it's defense of a technology-neutral approach to emission reduction.

SEMA maintained that the government should remain technology neutral when it comes to vehicle technology, noting EV's are part of our future but shouldn't be the only part, with fuel alternatives like biofuels, hydrogen, synthetics, hybrid and EV's all be part of the larger strategy to achieve cleaner admissions

Safety: The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) has proposed a regulation for a partial ban on chemicals found in brake cleaners and degreasers. The proposed rule is for 1-BP, a solvent commonly used in automotive care products such as engine degreasers, brake cleaners, refrigerant flushes and spray adhesives. If finalized as drafted, the proposal would ban use of all consumer products that contain 1-BP except when used in building and construction insulation materials. The ban would go into effect six months after the final rule is published. The rule would require extensive worker protection for industrial and commercial uses of 1-BP.

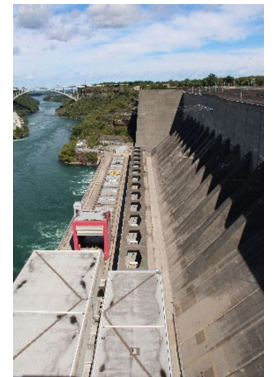
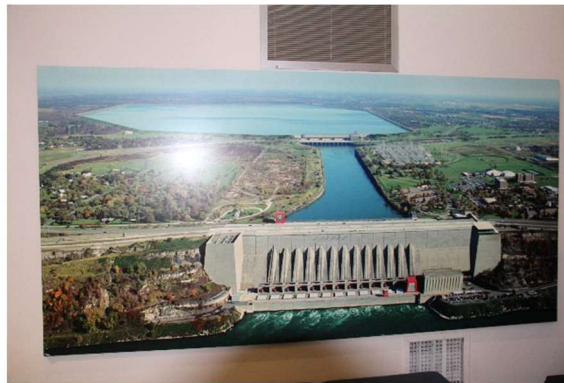

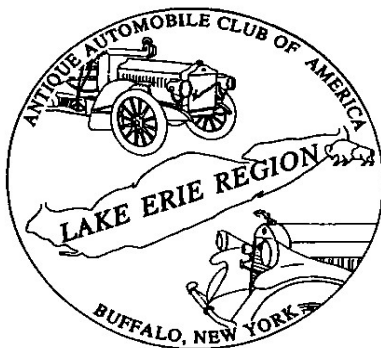
