

STRAWBERRY NUT BREAD

1 C. butter

1 ½ C. sugar 1 tsp. vanilla

½ tsp. lemon extract

4 eggs

3 C. flour

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. cream of tartar

½ tsp. baking soda 1 C. strawberry jam

i C. shawberry ja

½ C. sour cream

1 C. chopped walnuts



Cream butter. sugar, vanilla & lemon extract till fluffy. Add eggs 1 at a time, beating well after each. Sift together dry ingredients. Combine jam & cream. Add jam mix alternating with dry ingredients till well combined. Stir in nuts Grease 2 regular loaf pans, pour in batter.

Bake at 350 for 50-55 minutes. Cool 10 in pan, remove to rack.

RULES OF THE SHOW

- Cars 1925 & Older FREE Registration.
- Gate opens at 9:00 am.
- All Vehicles must be insured with proof.
- UL approved & fully charged Fire Extinguisher is required in all cars to be judged.
- "For Sale" signs are prohibited on Judging Field. These are allowed in the Display Only class only.
- All vehicles must be driven through registration and on to the Show Field under their own power
- Convertible tops and windows must be up for judging. Car doors should be unlocked so judges can view interiors. Hoods and trunks should be open during judging.
- All cars will be judged based on condition / restoration to the same state as the dealer could have prepared the car for delivery to the customer. This includes any feature, option or accessory shown in the original factory catalog, parts book, sales literature, or company directives for the model year of the vehicle. Point deductions will be made for each component that is incorrect, e.g. each radial tre found on a vehicle that was not originally delivered from the dealer with radials will be counted as a point deduction.
- Modifications or changes may result in point deduction except for Modified Classes.
- The Chief Judges have final decisions on all judging matters.
- AACA LER will not be responsible for damage to vehicles on show field
- Owner should remain with vehicle during judging.
- Care must be on the show field by NCON & should remain until trophies are awarded. Entrance gate will close at NOON.




