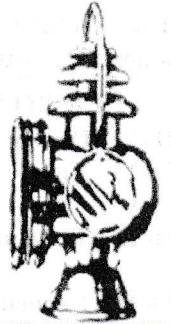

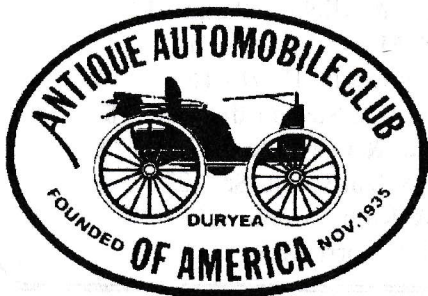

Taco Dip

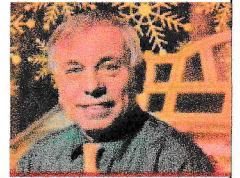
- 1 lb. extra lean ground beef

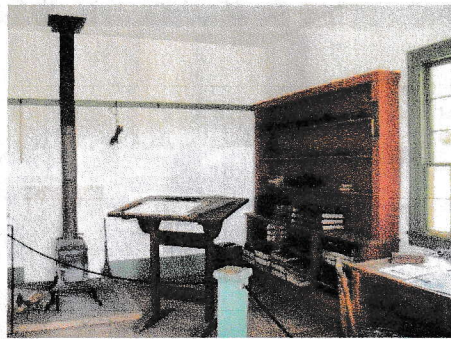

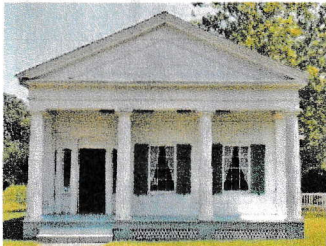

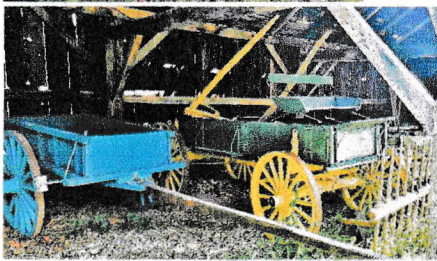
