The Best Air fried chicken recipe

1/2 cup flour

1 egg

4 small chicken thighs, skin on

1 1/2 tbsp all-purpose seasoning salt cooking spray

- 1. Preheat the Air fryer to 390 degrees.
- 2. Whisk together the flour, salt and the seasoning of choice.
- 3. Turn the chicken through the flour mixture, then into the egg, then back into the flour mixture again. Shake off excess flour very well. Spray the chicken with cooking spray lightly.
- 4.Place the 4 chicken thighs into the fryer. Then place that in to the bottom of the Air fryer cooking compartment. Cook for 25 minutes or until the chicken reaches 180 degrees. You can turn the chicken over halfway and spray again if desired.
- 5.Remove with tongs and serve



Old Car Festival

At The Henry Ford Greenfield Village

Candace and I, along with LER members Joe & Mary Momot, were among hundreds of participants taking part in this year's "Old Car Festival" at the Henry Ford in Dearborn, Michigan.

Old Car Festival at the Henry Ford is Americas longest running antique car show set in a place where the history of the American automobile not only is passionately preserved, but also comes to life.



For one weekend in September each year, for early motoring cars from the turn of the century (1900 -1932), Old Car Festival in Greenfield

Village creates an atmosphere for generations of car owners to share their passion with fans during this beloved tradition, showcasing an astounding array of restored vehicles in an authentic hometown-setting that immerses you in the past.

Driving the Greenfield Village streets, Candace and I cruised in our 1930 Ford Model A Coupe, rarely getting passed second



gear, while Joe and Mary Momot drove their 1927 Chevrolet Capital along with other early motoring car owners. We participated in the ongoing parade of electric,



steam and gas-powered cars that are constantly in motion all weekend long.

We wandered through the village talking with car owners about their treasured vehicles. And, stopped to visit some of the re-created historic shops, homes and displays from the early 1900's. Drivers can choose to engage themselves in fun "car games" supervised by the festival organizers. Candace and I in our 1930 Model A were fortunate to have won one of the games.



When we were not cruising the village ourselves, we sat back to watch beautifully restored vehicles cruise as they navigated the


crowded, but safe, village streets.

Saturday evening in the village offers impressive sights for the spectator as the "gaslight parade of cars" cruises the village at dusk, just as the sun begins to set. With headlights on, many of the early Ford Model T's, Buick Model 10's, and others from the early 1900's cruise the village with their original restored brass kerosene oil or acetylene lamps lit while others cruised with their electric headlamps on.

Car enthusiast come from all over the US and Canada to take part in the annual Old Car Festival at the Henry Ford Greenfield Village. Such a wonderful display of beautifully



restored classic cars from early years of American motoring is something rare to be seen on such a large scale in an authentic setting of past years that the Old Car Festival at the Henry Ford offers.

In 1907, as the American Electric Car Company, it began producing "Detroit Electrics." The success of the vehicle led to a rebranding in 1920, and the Detroit




