

Chef Sue has cooked up another tasty treat:

Zesty Turkey pasta salad

2 c. rotini pasta

1/2 c light sour cream

1/2 cup salsa

1/4 c. mayonnaise

2 Tbsp. skim milk

1/4 c. cilantro, chopped

1 c. pepper jack cheese

1 small tomato, chopped

2 c. Turkey, cooked and cubed

1 cucumber, peeled, seeded and chopped

Cook pasta according to package directions and drain; set aside. In large bowl, mix sour cream, salsa, mayonnaise and milk. Stir in remaining ingredients, including pasta, mix gently. Cover and chill at least 1 hour before serving.

Sue's Helpful Hint: To prevent staining of plastic containers, spray your container with nonstick spray before storing any food containing tomato sauce or any food that is apt to stain a plastic container.

## It's Easy to Attend a National Meet – Here's How


Hi all, The National AACA is having 2 National meets near us this Spring and Summer. I thought I would let our newer members know the process of attending one of these shows. Both these shows are National Meets where you can show your car to try to get a National 1<sup>st</sup> Junior award, HPOF (Historical Preservation of Original Features, for original cars) or DPA (Drivers Participation Award for showing your car at a National Meet). If you have been to our local Elma show the National Winners from our club are displayed in class 1A, 1B and 1C.

The first thing you need to do is to complete the National Meet postcard that comes in the plastic mailer with your National magazine. Complete the post card and send it back to National in Hershey PA. It doesn't cost you anything to request these for any event. You can also go on the National AACA website, AACA.org. Then you will receive back a brochure detailing the events that the local host club is doing. They usually have tours the day or two before highlighting the local area with evening social events/dinners. The car show would be on Saturday where you would show your car and that evening is the Awards

Banquet where the awards are given out. Once you receive this information from National you will need to use the registration form to register your car and if you want to do any of the tours/banquets planned. In the information you receive are also the local hotels that the local club has received special rates for the event. It makes for a very enjoyable weekend to be with other AACA members from outside our area. The first one is May 17-20 in Gettysburg PA and the other is in Norwich NY July 26-29 which I believe a few members have already booked rooms. Please let me know if you have any questions.





Don owned a 1961 Checker Station Wagon which he bought brand new on October 1, 1960 and drove it home from the factory in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Original price tag \$2,899 and was one of only 250 wagons made. The family drove the car 306,708 miles! Don founded and was President of the Checker Car Club of America in 1982. Last year the family donated his vehicle to the Checker Museum in Kalamazoo. Don also owned a 1933 Plymouth convertible and a 1964 Rambler sedan. He was a Navy veteran of WWII and served on a destroyer in the Pacific. Don & his late wife Beverly were active in the LER for many years. P.S. The car was on display at the Detroit Auto show Feb 25 & 26 of this year.
