





The History of the Buffalo Playboy Motor Car Company

The complete history of the Buffalo Playboy Car Company starting with the Charles Thomas "Rocket Car" and subsequent development of military vehicles and finally the revolutionary Playboy car will be discussed with many rare historical photos including the assembly line in what is now known as Engine Plant 4 of the Tonawanda GM facility. Also, the back story of the company name and how the "Playboy" name ended up years later on the iconic and infamous "Playboy" magazine.

The presentation will be presented by Dave Kaplan, grandson of the company president and creator of the vehicle idea and Chuck Facklam, now specialist in the technical aspects of the cars.



Legislative Affairs Info

ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

EPA grants California OK to ban sales of new gas-powered cars by 2035.

- The Biden administration has provided the green light for California and 11 other states (including New York) to ban the sale of new gas-powered cars by 2035.
- EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) approved California's ambitious plan, aligning with the state's push for environmental and cleaner air through the Advanced Clean Cars (ACC II) Regulations. These regulations mandate an increasing percentage of ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle), starting at 35% by 2026, to 100% by 2035.
- California's large economy influences vehicle regulations nationwide.
- Future political shifts could threaten California's environmental policies.

The above actions may face reversal by the Trump administration after the Jan. 20th inauguration. Stay alert to see if New York and the other 10 states continue to follow California. Considering the Supreme Courts consideration of the Legality of California's Clean Air Act Exemption.

SEMA-Supported Bill to Boost Outdoor Recreation Economy on the Brink of Becoming Law. As the 2023-24 Congress recessed the Senate passed the "expanding Public Lands Outdoor Recreation Experiences Act" (EXPLORE ACT), H.R. 6492. This bill will secure a significant boost for those who enjoy, support and cater to outdoor recreation. The bill will increase access to outdoor recreation opportunities and will help grow the outdoor recreation industry's \$1.2 trillion annual economic impact went to President's Biden's Desk for approval on Nov. 27th, 2024. **Update on 1/4/25 President Biden signed the bill into law.**

0**Safety Update:** SEMA has applauded California's Governor Gavin Newsom for his October 2024 veto of Senate Bill 961 for a Proposed Speed-Limiting Devises on new cars which was opposed by 69% of California's voters earlier in 2024. It was reported by SEMA Action Network (SAN) that New York introduced a SAN opposed legislation (A. 10712) to require most new vehicles to be equipped with intelligent speed assistance starting in 2029. These systems notify drivers every time they exceed the speed limit by 10 mph. This intrusive legislation threatens your driving experience and personal freedom. Although New York usually follows California almost all the time. It has failed to be recognized that this initiative failed in California after a 69% rejection of their voters followed by their Governor's Veto as noted above.

Miscellaneous: Here are a couple of Bills introduced in the NYS legislature that are worthy of watching.

1/08/25, NY S00261: Prohibits idling of any passenger vehicle for more than 3 minutes. 1st violation is a warning, subsequent ones are traffic violations subject to a \$150 fine. This has referred to Environmental Conservation.

1/08/25, NY A00075: Requires motor vehicle repair shops to disclose types of replacement parts used in automobile collision repairs and provides a disclosure form to be signed by the owner consenting to the use of any such parts; forbids use of any other parts except new original equipment manufacturer parts on any vehicle during the first year of its manufacture and for the two years following. This was referred to Transportation.

1/08/25, NY S00344: Provides that a person may operate a fully autonomous vehicle on the public roads of this state without a human driver provided that the automated driving system is engaged, and the vehicle meets certain conditions; defines terms; requires insurance and that such vehicle is registered as a fully autonomous vehicle; makes related provisions. This was referred to Transportation.






