



ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

SEMA Celebrates End of EV Mandates in the US: The US Senate, following the House, has voted bipartisan to overturn California's Advanced Clean Cars II (ACCII) regulation, stopping the effort to ban internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles through EV mandates. Both branches have shown courage in the face of radical policy makers, by exhibiting confidence in American Innovation and ingenuity of the automotive aftermarket. Congress' vote contributes to stability in the automotive market and supports investment examples like the recent multi-million dollar investment in the Chevy engine plant in Tonawanda, NY.

New York State's Gov. Kathy Holcul is pushing NY's version of their Clean Cars II (ACCII): It is set to be fully enacted by 2035. However, NY State Democrat Lawmakers are pushing her to pause the almost impossible mandate. Trucking companies, and auto dealers in the state are also pushing for a delay. I found the following piece from NBZ-FM (106.3) radio titled "State residents are not buying electric vehicles at the rate needed to comply with a 2035 mandate". "While there is evidence suggesting the rate of growth in electric vehicle sales in New York State is slowing down, the government is doubling down on its efforts to push EV's on state residents. New York announced a new interagency working group focused on the implementation of the clean vehicle transition. The group will collaborate with vehicle manufacturers and other stakeholders to rapidly accelerate the deployment of charging infrastructure across New York State. In 2021, Governor Hochul signed into law a phase out of the sale of fossil fuel vehicles by 2035". Also, from an April 2025 announcement "Governor Hochul announced \$30 million is now available for consumers to lease or purchase new EVs in New York through the State's Drive Clean Rebate program, which provides point-of-sale rebates for more than 60 new EV models".

"Ban the Ban" continues to roll forward with Delaware, vowing to block EV mandate, and Vermont, pausing their EV mandate have joined movement. Currently Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, and Vermont each have backed-off pledges to follow

California's emissions policies while North Carolina, Texas, Ohio, West Virginia, and eight other states passed SEMA-supported "ban the ban" legislation to ensure such mandates never take effect again.

<u>Tariff Update</u>: Tariffs are continuing to be a complex topic that can evoke strong emotions and concerns. It seems to change daily. Court injunctions challenging tariffs add more confusion.

U.S. Announces a 90 day Tariff Truce with China: Under the agreement both the United Staes and China will reduce tariffs imposed in 2025 by 115%. Chinese imports to the United States will be subject to a 30% tariff, which includes the standard 10% county-by-country tariff along with a 20% tariff under the international Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA)to address the flow of fentanyl into the United States. Meanwhile, American exports to China will be subject to a 10% tariff. Products imported from China are still subject to Section 232 Tariffs of 25% that were fist imposed in 2018.

<u>U.S., Mexico, Canada Tarriff Update</u>: Auto parts that are compliant with USMCA (United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement) will now be **exempt** from 25% Tariff.

I expect that tariffs will continue to be in flux for the next few months due to continuing negotiations and court injunctions along with questions from congressional members on both sides of the aisle.

Classic / Antique Car Beat Update: In a big step forward for car enthusiasts, burgeoning collectors and SEMA members as a whole, "Leno's Law" (SB 712) is now heading to the California Senate Floor for a full vote. If enacted, the law would exempt vehicles 35 years or older from smog checks provided they are insured as collector cars. "From car shows to weekend cruises, classic cars bring people together and keep history vibrant," added Senator Grove, sponsor of (SB 712).
