Legislative Affairs Info ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

SEMA Celebrates End of EV Mandates in the US: President Trump signed a Congressional Review Act resolution that will protect 330,000 American Jobs and preserve \$100 billion in economic impact for the nation's economy by revoking a waiver that would have enable California to ban ICE vehicles. Many states not named California released the harms of EV mandates. VIRGINIA, Maryland, Delaware, and Vermont each have backed off of policies to follow California's emissions policies while North Carolina, Texas, Ohio, West Virginia and eight other states passed the "ban the ban" legislation to ensure such mandates never take effect again. However, as you may notice New York is still following California's lead.

Update - New York State's Gov. Kathy Hochul is pushing NY's version of their Clean Cars II (ACCII): As previously reported EV sales in NY are currently close to 10%. The DEC's (Department of Environmental Conservation) ACCII (Advanced Clean Cars II) Letter of Assurance & Enforcement Discretion on February 14, 2025, stated they were aware of concerns by OEMs (Original Equipment Manufacturers) related to ZEV provisions of ACCII that require manufacturers of passenger cars and light trucks and deliver for sale an increasing percentage of ZEVs. For instance, ACCII mandates that manufacturers produce Zero Emission Vehicles (ZEVs) at a rate of 35% of light-duty vehicles in the first model year (MY 2026), increasing to 43% in the second model year, and continuing accordingly. Manufacturers may use battery-electric vehicles (BEVs), fuel-cell electric vehicles (FCEVs), and plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEVs). Governor Hochul has indicated that the electric grid capacity may not be sufficient to support the increasing demand for electric power. There is a possibility of brownouts and power shortages within the next decade if new nuclear plants are not built or existing ones are not reactivated. Gov. Governor Hochul has not yet provided details regarding the locations of new nuclear plants in upstate New York, the management of nuclear waste, or the strategies for handling excess heat and water from cooling processes.

<u>Tariff Update</u>: Tariffs are continuing to be a complex topic that can evoke strong emotions and concerns. It seems to change daily. Court injunctions challenging tariffs add more confusion.

BIG Tariff News: New Clarification on Stacking: President Trump signed a proclamation in early June doubling tariffs on imported steel and aluminum from 25 to 50%. This initiative aimed to boost domestic metal production and will have a significant

impact on specialty automotive aftermarket businesses that import products that contain steel and aluminum if the product is not subject to the 232 automotive tariffs. The U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) updated Guidance on Tariff Stacking. Effective June 4th for imported goods that are subject to more of the tariffs listed below, duties are applied in the following order based on these key rules:

1. Section 232 Auto/Auto Parts:

- 1. If the part or vehicle falls under the 232 automotive parts tariffs, it is exempt from the following tariffs: 232 Aluminum, 232 Steel, and IEEPA (International Emergency Economic Powers Act) Canada/Mexico.
- 2. However, auto parts that qualify under USMCA are not subject to 232 Auto/Auto Parts or IEEPA tariffs
- 2. Section 232 Aluminum and Steel:
 - 1. If the automotive/auto parts tariff does not apply, determine if the article is subject to aluminum and /or steel tariffs.
 - 2. Duties on derivative products are calculated based on the value of each constituent metal.
 - 3. If applicable, the item is not subject to IEEPA Canada and Mexico Tariffs.
 - 4. Russia Note: Imports with aluminum, either smelted or cast in Russia, face a 200% Section 232 duty.
- 3. IEEPA Canada and Mexico
 - 1. These Tariffs only apply if the auto/auto parts, aluminum, and steel tariffs do not.
 - 2. USMCA- qualified articles are exempt from IEEPA tariffs.

CBP Updated Guidance on Steel and Aluminum Imports:

Effective June 4th, products categorized under Chapter 73 (articles of iron or steel) or Chapter 76 (articles of aluminum) will be subject to a 50% duty solely on the steel/aluminum content of those products. Historically, the tariff was calculated based on the entire value of the imported product. Additional and updated chapter 99 for section 232 steel and aluminum imports

<u>USTR (United States Trade Representative) Extends Certain</u> Exclusions from China Section 301 Tariffs:

The USTR has extended the expiration date for Section 301 exclusions from May 31, 2025 to August 31, 2025.

Classic / Antique Car Update: Senate Bill 712, referred to as "Leno's Law," has had its implementation postponed to 2027 due to technology updates at the DMV and a budget deficit. I will continue to report on the status of "Leno's Law" next month.
