

Legislative Affairs Info

ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

<u>Tariff Update</u>: Tariffs are continuing to be a complex topic that can evoke strong emotions and concerns. It seems to change daily. Court injunctions challenging tariffs add more confusion.

President Trmp's August 1st deadline for new deals with international trade partners has come and gone. Here's how things stand, with analysis of the impact on the automobile aftermarket industry.

- The White House issued a July 31st Executive Order expanding tariffs on a broad range of foreign goods, including automotive components central to the specialty aftermarket industry
- While several notable trading partners notably the European Union (EU), Japan, South Korea, Indonesia, and the Philippines have recently secured trade deals with the U.S. that lock in lower tariff rates, many others face increases in duties effective August 7 that are likely to effect sully chains and pricing.
- The new tariff rates apply to goods entered for consumption or withdrawn from a warehouse for consumption on or after August 7, at 12:01 a.m. (EDT), unless the product is in its final mode of transit before that date and withdrawn for consumption before 10/5/25.

The above are current rates, there are exceptions tied to steel, aluminum, automobiles, and auto parts by country that would be too lengthy to cover here. Copper Tariff Increase: The United States has implemented a 50% tariff on all imports of semi-finished copper

products and intensive copper derivative products, effective at 12:01 a.m. Eastern Time August 1st.

SEMA Shines Spotlight on ADAS,, Todays Most Pressing Automotive Issue: With safety concerns front on mind, SEMA is urging the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and Congress to take a long look, unflinching look at how the federal government can deliver advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS) policies and guidelines that account for the needs of vehicle owners and the aftermarket amid the rapid, unparalleled advance of vehicle safety technology.

Aftermarket companies manufacture, sell and service popular and widely used products like vehicle wraps, lift kits, bike racks, bumpers, winches, and side view mirrors, which must operate harmoniously with the technology automakers employ to support ADAS features on modern vehicles and thus ensure safety systems continue to be operated as intended for the full lifecycle of a vehicle. As a result, ensuring proper calibration and recalibration of safety systems is a critical consideration for maintaining driver and passenger safety following these common modifications.

USDOT has requested information on the upcoming surface transportation reauthorization bill, commonly known as "the highway bill". SEMA is requesting that USDOT and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) work with Congress to craft a bill addressing the following through rulemaking and the issuance of guidance and industry requirement:

- Establish modification ranges and tolerances for new vehicles.
- Develop guidelines that ensure proper calibration of ADAS and create neutral validation protocols.
- Create either a visible diagnostic indicator to determine ADAS operational status or an electronic diagnostic indicator for ADAS status.
- Require that automakers make full lifecycle support for ADAS achievable.
- Provide full access to Vehicle Dynamic Systems and data needed to maintain compliance and functionality.

Classic / Antique Car Update: Senate Bill 712, referred to as "Leno's Law," has had its implementation postponed to 2027 due to technology updates at the DMV and a budget deficit. The finish line is in sight but still stalled in committee. I will continue to report on the status of "Leno's Law" next month.
