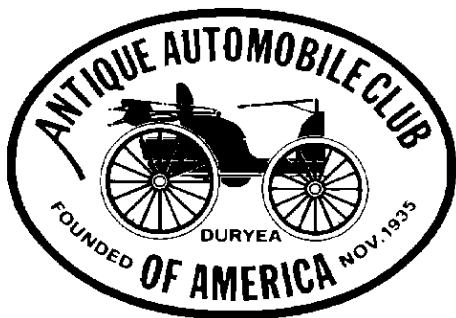

## Did You Know?

Walter L. Jacobs started a Rent-a-Car company in 1918 with just 12 Model T Fords. John D. Hertz began selling cars for Walden W. Shaw in 1905 and introduced the trade in business. This left Hertz & Shaw with many used vehicles with they offered for hire as taxis. Hertz became interested in the Rent-a-Car company and purchased the company in 1923 which was renamed Hertz Drive-Ur-Self System. Within 5 years they had over 600 vehicles. Hertz sold the rental company to General Motors in 1927. He repurchased the company in 1953. Today it is one of the three big rental car companies operating under Hertz as well as several other brands including Thrifty Car Rental.

## RULES OF THE SHOW

- Cars 1925 & Older – FREE Registration.
- Gate opens at 9:00 am.
- All Vehicles must be insured with proof.
- UL approved & fully charged Fire Extinguisher is required in all cars to be judged.
- “For Sale” signs are prohibited on Judging Field, they are allowed in the “Display Only” class 19 only.
- All vehicles must be driven through registration and on to the Show Field under their own power.
- Convertible tops and windows must be up for judging. Car doors should be unlocked so judges can view interiors. Hoods and trunks should be open during judging.
- All cars will be judged based on condition / restoration to the same state as the dealer could have prepared the car for delivery to the customer. This includes any feature, option or accessory shown in the original factory catalog, parts book, sales literature, for the model year of the vehicle. Point deductions will be made for each component that is incorrect, e.g. each radial tire found on a vehicle that was not originally delivered from the dealer with radials will be counted as a point deduction.
- Modifications or changes may result in point deduction except for Modified Classes.
- The Chief Judge has final decisions on all judging matters.
- AACA LER will not be responsible for damage to vehicles on show field.
- Owner should remain with vehicle during judging.
- **Cars must be on the show field by NOON & should remain until trophies are awarded. Registration will close at NOON.**

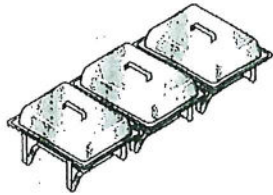

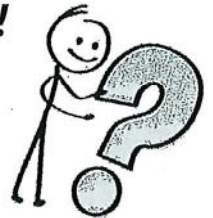

## Legislative Affairs Info

### ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

**Current Events:** What a year! U.S. and Israeli military actions against Iran, the recent U.S. Supreme Court decision on tariffs, the Greenland territorial dispute, and the situation in Venezuela may all have significant implications, including potential effects on tariffs, as well as the cost and availability of goods, fuel, automobiles, and automotive parts. Hopefully, the US and Israel will successfully negotiate a cease fire and a surrender that will stabilize the middle east and the rest of the world.

**What Effects Might Iran Have on the International Automobile Market?** The Middle East conflict has already threatened to create an auto industry supply chain crunch. Oil, aluminum, semiconductor parts and plastics keep the auto industry running. **Oil:** About a fifth of the world's supply flows through the straits of Hormuz and they have stopped but will not fully resume for months. This, as we all know, gas, diesel, and heating oil prices are increasing. **Aluminum:** The US imports between 80% and 90% of the aluminum it uses with about 20% comes from the Gulf. Prices have reached their highest level in almost four years according to a Bloomberg report. **Semiconductor Material:** The war could also cut supplies of semiconductor manufacturing materials such as helium, Reuters reported on March 4<sup>th</sup>. Helium is produced by various countries, with the United States and Qatar serving as leading sources of supply. **Plastics:** The Middle East is a big supplier of petrochemicals. Disruptions in petrochemical production and distribution could raise automotive plastics and chemicals by between 15 and 25 percent. Standard vehicles contain between 330 and 440 pounds of plastic made from petrochemicals. **Past supply chain disruptions:** over the last few years – a pandemic, semiconductor shortage, new tariff rates, now the Iran War – exposes the depth and complexity of the global auto industry.

### SEMA's Advocacy Agenda for 2026 Include Four Areas Listed Below along with Recent Activity:

**Establishing the right to Modify Vehicles:** Ohio Governor Mike DeWine signed a SEMA supported bill (HB201) that will safeguard the diversity of options available to Ohioans, allowing them to choose vehicles that align with their budgets, driving habits and personal preferences including power source.

**Protecting and Expanding Motorized Access to Public Lands:** ORBA (Off-Road Business Assoc.), and SEMA with an expanded advocacy strategy, enhanced research capabilities, and a renewed commitment to coalition-based action to protect the future of the off-road industry and enthusiast community was relaunched in Washington, D.C. 3/25/26. The focus will be on powersports and dirt bikes as well as trucks, and SUVs. What is new is a more rigorous, data-driven approach that includes regional economic reports, consumer research, and deeper collaboration across the outdoor recreational ecosystem.

**Protecting Racetracks and the Future of Motorsports:** Kansas Governor Laura Kelly signed Kansas Motorsports Venue Protection Act (HB24160) into law which will provide protection from nuisance laws in the state of Kansas. Georgia, Missouri, and Wisconsin in a coordinated state effort with the help of SEMA and PRI to provide consistent protections for motorsports facilities nationwide.

**Preserving Our Automotive Heritage:** SEMA continues to defend the rights of classic car owners and enthusiasts against state-level policies that impose unreasonable restrictions on older and modified vehicles. This includes supporting Leno's Law.

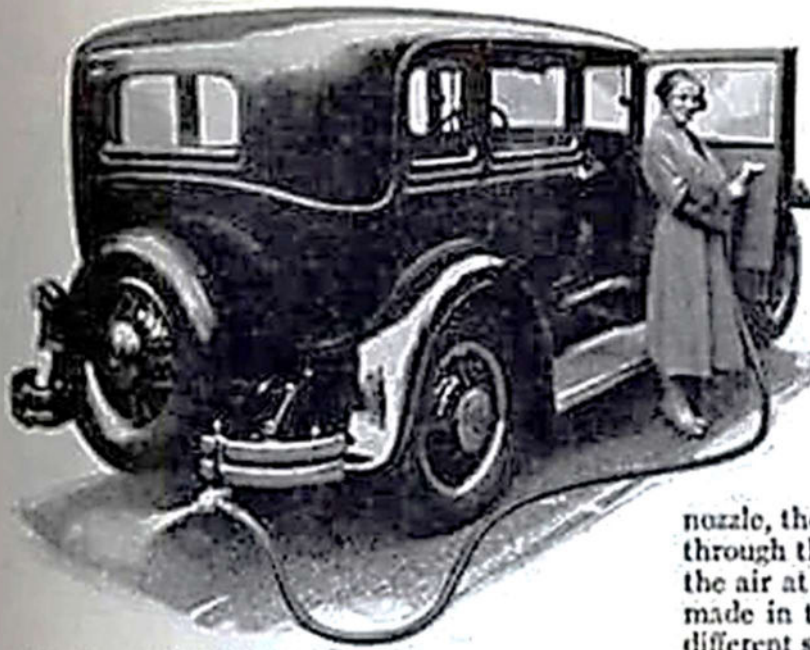

Using the exhaust gas of the automobile to clean the upholstery is the accomplishment of a recently invented device. An aluminum attachment is fastened to the exhaust pipe and the engine is allowed to idle. As the exhaust gas passes through this device suction is created at the inlet hole. Collected by a nozzle, the dust and dirt are drawn through the hose and expelled into the air at the rear of the car. It is made in three models, for cars of different size.

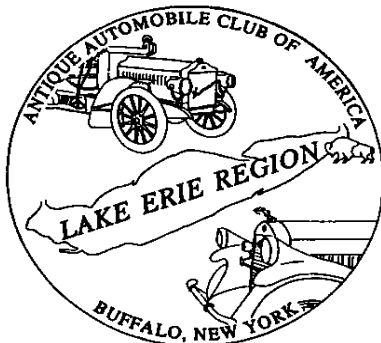
