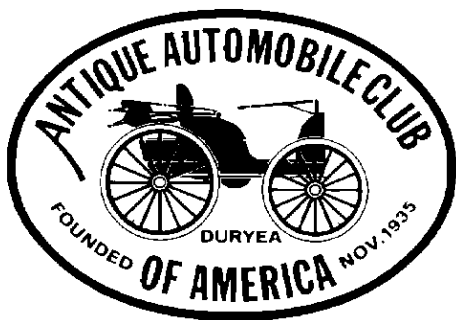

Did You Know?

That if you attend a National Meet, you are eligible for Activities Awards points? It doesn't matter where the meet is, it is still an AACA event and will earn you points. You could earn as much as 30 points if you attend, enter a car and/or judge. Peggy Ptak keeps track of those points and at the end of the year, the top point getters receive a special prize. So don't forget to sign in at each event you attend, and let Peggy know about any AACA events you attend outside of LER. After spending Easter with my daughter and grandkids in the Raleigh, NC area, I was fortunate enough to head over to Charlotte Motor Speedway in Charlotte, NC on Friday April 10th to take in the Charlotte Autofair hosted by the Hornets' Nest Region of AACA. This is an annual event at the speedway that kicks off the auto season in the Southeast. The 3-day event includes a huge collector car flea market, car corral, and participation from many of the local car clubs that displayed hundreds of classic and custom cars and trucks down along the front straightaway and pit area. The entire speedway interior is occupied with automobile enthusiasts either showing a vehicle or occupying a swap space.

The weather was perfect for the two days I was there. The main attraction of this event was the AACA Southeastern Spring Nationals held on Saturday April 11th in the speedway infield. Over 200 antique and classic cars were present for AACA points judging. Some of you may know I am a Pontiac fan and the current Concours Coordinator for the GTO Association of America. I am responsible for judge training and

vehicle classification at the GTOAA national convention each summer. I met up with a fellow GTOAA and AACA member from the Charlotte area to check out the AACA judging procedure and get some insight on how AACA approaches the classic vehicles on the show field. I was introduced to both Stan Kulikowski and Jack Harris, both current members of the AACA Board of Directors. I had a long discussion with Stan after the judges meeting and prior to the start of judging comparing each club's judging guidelines.

The quality of the vehicles was outstanding. I came away with some good information experiencing the AACA National atmosphere and look forward to attending again. Next year's Charlotte event will be a Grand National show. I can only imagine the quality of cars that will be present next time.

RULES OF THE SHOW

- Cars 1925 & Older – FREE Registration.
- Gate opens at 9:00 am.
- All Vehicles must be insured with proof.
- UL approved & fully charged Fire Extinguisher is required in all cars to be judged.
- “For Sale” signs are prohibited on Judging Field, they are allowed in the “Display Only” class 19 only.
- All vehicles must be driven through registration and on to the Show Field under their own power.
- Convertible tops and windows must be up for judging. Car doors should be unlocked so judges can view interiors. Hoods and trunks should be open during judging.
- All cars will be judged based on condition / restoration to the same state as the dealer could have prepared the car for delivery to the customer. This includes any feature, option or accessory shown in the original factory catalog, parts book, sales literature, for the model year of the vehicle. Point deductions will be made for each component that is incorrect, e.g. each radial tire found on a vehicle that was not originally delivered from the dealer with radials will be counted as a point deduction.
- Modifications or changes may result in point deduction except for Modified Classes.
- The Chief Judge has final decisions on all judging matters.
- AACA LER will not be responsible for damage to vehicles on show field.
- Owner should remain with vehicle during judging.
- **Cars must be on the show field by NOON & should remain until trophies are awarded. Registration will close at NOON.**

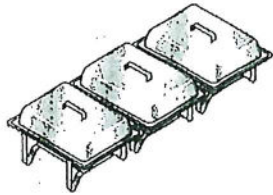

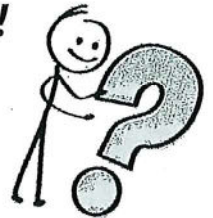

ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

Current Events: The stalemate between the U.S. and Israel with Iran is still in effect causing an impact on everything, including gasoline, diesel fuel, heating oil, natural gas, and every item that needs to be moved to where we purchase or use it. U.S. Reshapes Tariffs on Steel, Aluminum, and Derivative Products: The Trump Administration announced updates to Section 232 tariffs covering steel, aluminum, and certain derivative products. Effective April 6, businesses importing products containing steel and aluminum will be subject to a 25% tariff applied to the full value of the imported product replacing the previous 50% tariff of the embedded steel and aluminum content. This approach is intended to simplify compliance while protecting domestic producers.

Protecting Racetracks and the Future of Motorsports: Last month I reported that Kansas's Right to Race Law was signed into law along with a coordinated effort of Georgia, Missouri, and Wisconsin with help from SEMA an PRI (Performance Racing INDUSTRY) to provide consistent protection for motorsports facilities nationwide. However, After Wisconsin's Legislature passed AB 880 the Right to Race Bill sending to the Governor to be signed into law. Then on April 9th, Wisconsin's Governor Tony Evers, vetoed AB 880, after claiming he supported the bill. This is a true setback for this important SEMA / PRI 2026 goal.

U.S. House Subcommittee Passes SEMA-Backed ADAS Bill, Critical Step for Right to Modify; ADAS (Advanced Driver Assistance Systems) Functionality and Integrity Act (HR6688) took a giant step forward when the SEMA-supported bill passed the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee via a voice vote. This is a critical step for the Right to Modify. Instead of forcing vehicle owners and aftermarket businesses to guess whether safety system are fully operational following modifications, the information

provided by HR6688 would enable the aftermarket to answer the question, "Do these ADAS systems continue to operate as intended". Equally important, HR6688 is bipartisan; the bill reflects growing consensus that safety and consumer freedoms are not mutually exclusive. Federal policy must encourage technological advancement while preserving the vibrant after market ecosystem that supports millions of jobs and billions in economic activity.

LENO'S LAW UPDATE: California's renewed "Leno's Law" just cleared an important hurdle. California SB 1392, authored by Sen Dave Cortese, with Sen Shannon Grove has passed the California State Senate Transportation Committee with bipartisan support. This proposed law creates a narrow, phased-in, collector-only pathway to a smog-check exemption for certain older vehicles. The bill starts with vehicles manufactured before the '81 model year and gradually expands, reaching vehicles manufactured before the '86 model year by 2032. Importantly, it does not change the existing pre-'76 exemption already in law.

NY State EV (Electric Vehicle) Mandate: By the end of 2026 the state EV mandate requires all passenger cars, SUVs, and pickup trucks sales to be 35% electric. By 2030 the number climbs to 68%, and to 100% by 2035. The batteries in EV's are lithium-ion. Are we really ready for three million EV's NYS projects on the road by 2030?

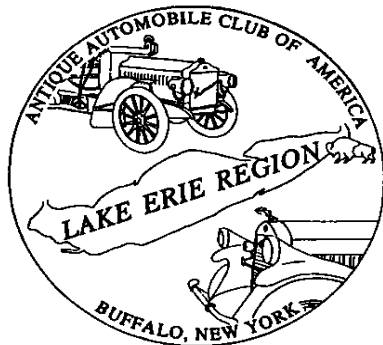
