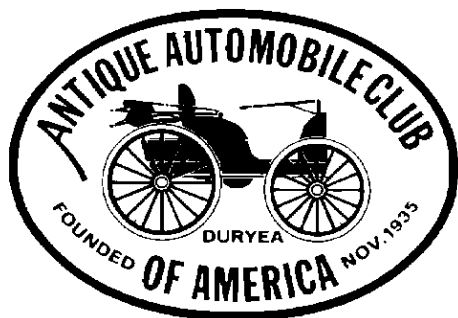

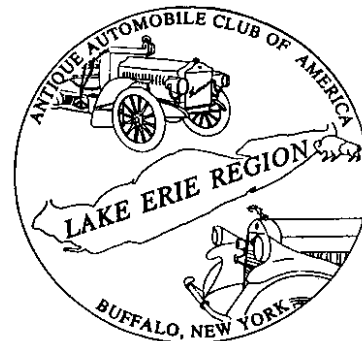

ZEV (Zero Emission Vehicle) / ICE (Internal Combustion Engine) / Vehicle Choice

The U.S. and Mexico conclude their first round of trade deal talks on autos, metals, and security: The U.S. and Mexico trade negotiators concluded their first round of bilateral negotiations to revise the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) on trade, discussing automotive rules of origin, steel, and aluminum trade, and economic security, according to the U.S. Trade Representatives (USTR) office. "The United States concluded discussions with the goal of reducing the trade deficit with Mexico and strengthening American supply chains," USTR said in a statement. The two sides will continue to advance their discussions on June 16-17 in Washington, D.C., covering agriculture, "a level playing field". A third round is scheduled for the week of July 20th in Mexico City, but so the talks have excluded USMCA partner Canada.

"Your Next Oil Change Could Get More Expensive and Harder to Schedule: Due to disruptions in the Persian Gulf are raising fear of higher prices, possibly within a month along with less availability that could affect your ability schedule your next oil change. This could affect millions of mainstream vehicles on American roads.

U.S. House Committee Advances Legislation, to Enact Right-to-Repair Provisions: HR6688 the ADAS Functionality and Integrity Act has been amended and is now part of HR7389 the Motor Vehicle Modernization Act of 2026 which requires the NHTSA (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration) to create a working group to help educate consumers about ADAS and automated driving systems (ADS) within 180 days of the bill's enactment. According to the bill, the group will recommend education and marketing strategies to NHTSA that "may be voluntarily employed by industry stakeholders to inform the public responsibly." The consumer education will highlight the differences between ADAS-

equipped vehicles that assist with acceleration, braking, or steering, those that assist with all three and ADS-equipped vehicles. The NHTSA will have to incorporate representatives from multiple sectors in the working group if the bill is passed, including:

- Automakers.
- Dealers.
- Vehicle owners and operators, including fleet managers.
- Consumers and consumer advocacy groups.
- "Entities with national experience in consumer education".
- Safety organizations and
- National organizations advocating for those who have disabilities or are elderly.

Members of the working group will not be compensated, according to the bill, and the group will disband after submitting its required report.

NY State EV (Electric Vehicle) Mandate: As reported last month the NY EV mandate requires all passenger cars, SUVs, and pickup trucks sales to be 35% electric by the end of 2026. Some Buffalo NY car dealers have indicated they are genuinely concerned and indicated that the mandate is out of touch with reality and want it repealed as soon as possible. One dealer said, "We are for EV vehicles, we are for cleaner air, but we won't force our customers to buy something they don't want to buy." Another factor is the infrastructure to support the charging of all these new vehicles that would be on the roads, simply put, the grid is not adequate to support all this product yet.

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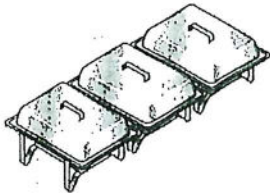

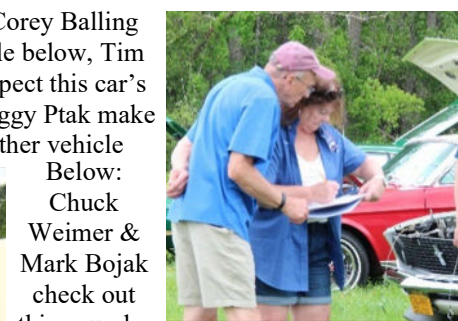

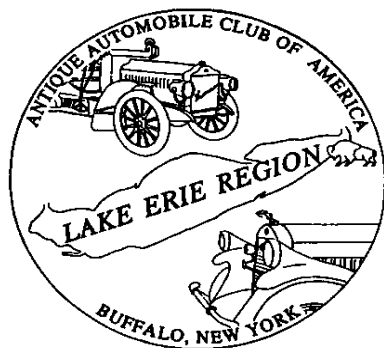
