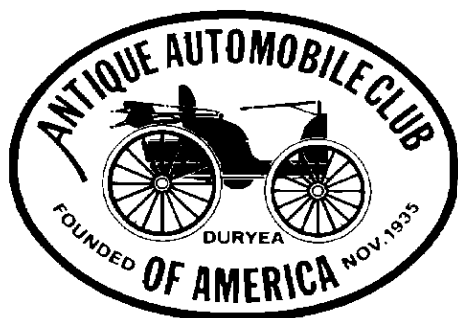

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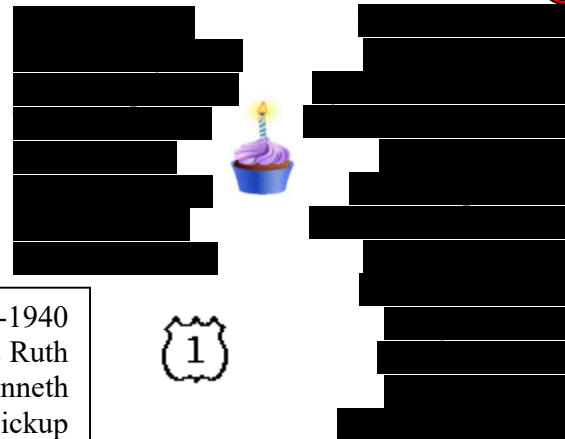

SEMA Statement on President Trump's Freedom-To-Fix Presidential Memorandum: "President Trump's presidential memorandum is more bold action in support of vehicle owners and automotive aftermarket industry businesses from across the nation, and an example of federal leadership on behalf of our nation's vibrant car culture. Specifically, Section 3 of today's memorandum acknowledges the need for certainty at the federal level for automotive aftermarket businesses who seek to certify the emissions compliance of their products. We look forward to further details from EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin as the agency finalizes its guidance on this memorandum."

What Recent Market Trends Mean for the Aftermarket: The Gulf and Strait of Hormuz conflict is not entirely settled and has now ended with the US and Iran trading attacks. Even with the current state crude oil prices have increased to \$80.19 per barrel up from \$70 about a week ago but still down from \$100 in April and May. Hope is with the U.S. plan to take control of the Gulf and Strait of Hormuz the price of Crude may yet approach the \$65 rate.

Consumer Price Index: The May Consumer Price Index rose to 4.2%, driven by a 23.5% increase in energy costs and most notably a 40.5% increase in gas prices. June's Consumer Price Index and may hold for June. Gas prices had dropped but now are on the increasing, which is one of the most visible signs of inflation.

Inflation: With inflation elevated, the Fed kept the federal funds rate unchanged at 3.50%-3.75% in June 2026, as expected. The current rate is significantly lower than it was in 2025, which may enable consumers to refinance auto loans at lower rates. Fed governors appear to be split on whether there should be additional cuts or possible rate hikes later in the year. So far, these interest rates have not shown a negative impact on employment.

Unemployment: The unemployment rate held steady in May at 4.3%, while the economy gained 172,000 jobs.

June's Seasonally Adjusted U-3 unemployment Rate is 4.2% down from 4.3%. The employment market has stayed very stable with an unemployment rate between 4.3%-4.5% over the last year. The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia Survey of Professional Forecasters predicts the unemployment rate to remain steady with an average between 4.4%-4.5% over the next few quarters. The stable job market should keep consumers confident in their ability to spend through the remainder of the year.

Economy: The economy continues to grow, and the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reported that real GDP increased at an annual rate of 2.1% in Q1 2026. This growth is significantly higher than the 0.5% rate reported in Q4 2025. Consumers are better off, with personal income increasing \$181.6 billion (0.7% at a monthly rate) in May. Spending was up by 0.7% with an added \$156.1 billion pumped into the economy. Motor vehicle and parts spending was up by \$5.4 billion in May. Total consumer spending reached \$22 trillion in May and has shown no signs of slowing down. The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia Survey of Professional Forecasters predicts real GDP to expand 2.2% in 2026.

Major CARB Reform Advances in California, Speeding Aftermarket Parts to Market: A SEMA-sponsored California bill to reform the California Air Resources Board's (CARB) Executive Order (EO) process for aftermarket emissions-related parts has cleared another legislative hurdle and now includes a long-demanded pathway for companies to bring their products to the California market faster.

Route 66 April 2026 Arizona and California Centennial Trip by George and Ruth Camann

April 2026 Ruth and I have made our third and final trip to complete our Mother Road experience to coincide with the celebration of the 100th Year Anniversary of Route 66, Photo 1. We have come across

ARIZONA ROUTE 66

We began in Williams, AZ where there is a train station for the Grand Canyon Railway. We stopped at the Rt 66 Museum and Gift Shop where there is an old Diamond T Truck from Keene Valley, NY, Photo 2. Near a Circle K Gas Station is a mural showing Williams, AZ as the last city on Rt 66 by-passed by I-40, Photo 3. The next town of Ash Fork has a 1958

Desoto perched on the roof of an old Rt 66 gas station, Photo 4. We stayed overnight at the Route 66 Motel in Seligman and had lunch at the Roadkill Café noted for "You Kill It, We'll Grill It". We stopped at the

Roadrunner Café and Gift Shop where a Henry J Gasser was

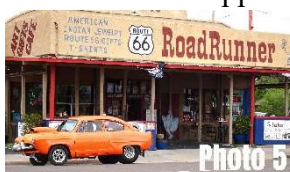

parked, Photo 5.

The next day we headed west, we stopped at the Hackberry General Store, Photo 6. Our next destination was Topock, AZ using I-40, then back on Route 66 traveling on the Arizona Sidewinder Rd that takes us through Sitgreaves Pass which includes 191

turns in 8 miles with NO guardrails. Its road is steep and has many tight switchbacks. I cannot imagine what travelers thought while driving west on this part of Rt 66 until 1952, when it was bypassed by I-40. You can see remains of cars that drove off the road's steep embankments. Along this road we stopped at Oatman, AZ. It is an old gold mining town with shops, cafes and daily shootouts between the sheriff and bank robbers. Watch out for the many wild burros that wander around looking to be fed by tourists, Photo 7. We also stopped at the Cool Springs 1926 Store which was burned down making the movie "Universal Soldier" and rebuilt since. This stone building is said to be the inspiration for Radiator Springs in the Cars movie. Photo 8.

Schulz once lived. From there we followed Route 66 across the open desert to Amboy and stopped at the iconic Roy's Motel and Café, Photo 11. In Newberry Springs, we visited the Bagdad Café, made famous by the German film *Bagdad Café*. While the movie itself was not one of our favorites, it has become a cult classic in Europe, and many European travelers still treat it as a highlight of any Route 66 journey, Photo 12. By evening we

reached Barstow and stayed overnight, where Photo 13 captures an old car parked at the Route 66 Motel. Continuing on to Victorville, we explored the Route 66 Museum, where Photos 14 and 15 feature a 1958 Edsel Bermuda and vintage engine-testing equipment that brought the road's past to life. One of the most unforgettable stops was Elmer's Bottle Tree Ranch in Oro Grande, where a forest of glittering glass creations rose from the desert, Photo

16. We also spent the night at the famous Wigwam Motel in San Bernardino, Photo 17. While in San Bernardino, the birthplace of McDonald's in 1940, we toured the Historic Original

McDonald's Museum. Photo 18 brings back another era entirely, with menu prices that seem almost unbelievable today. Do you remember when a McDonald's hamburger cost just 15 cents? Our final California stop was the original Richfield Service Station in Rancho Cucamonga, Photo 19. Built in 1915, it stood assisting travelers long before Route 66 officially came into being.

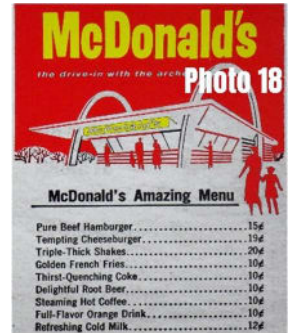

SB 1069, authored by Sen. Tim Grayson (D-Concord), passed the Assembly Transportation Committee unanimously and now heads to the Assembly Appropriations Committee for consideration.

The bill has been significantly amended to establish a new conditional approval process for qualifying aftermarket parts.

- Under the amended bill, manufacturers that submit a complete EO application supported by emissions testing and technical documentation may receive conditional approval to sell, advertise, and install qualifying products while CARB completes its review. Today, manufacturers often wait months or years for a final EO before they can legally bring a product to market in California.

- This new approach allows companies to begin generating revenue while CARB's review is ongoing, helping manufacturers recover development and compliance costs sooner.

- To qualify, manufacturers must submit a complete application supported by emissions testing and technical documentation and have a demonstrated record of compliance through prior participation in CARB's EO program.

- The bill also reinforces the value of the SEMA Garage and its SEMA Certified-Emissions program by creating a streamlined pathway for manufacturers that invest upfront in emissions compliance and comprehensive application packages.

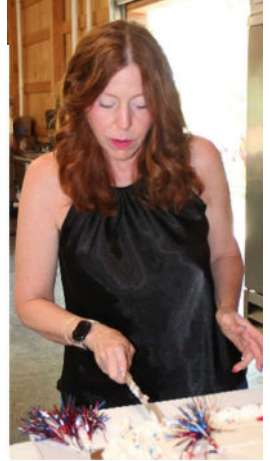

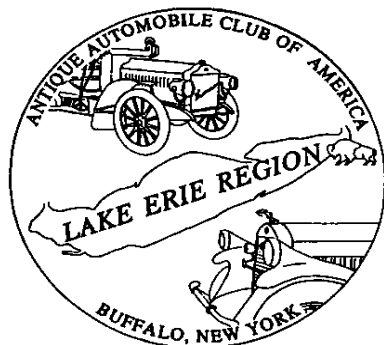
