Hi All,

In case you have forgotten here's some news about a very special automobile that was developed right here in Western New York with connections to the Playboy automobile (the designer went on to work for Playboy Auto Inc. of Buffalo, NY). The Rocket Car (nothing to do

with rockets at all) was developed by a couple of fellows from Batavia, NY. They were employed by GM before designing and building their own automobile that they knew was better than anything on the market back in the mid-thirties. Their car had advanced features such as hanging brake and clutch peddles, independent four-wheel suspension and the forerunner of today's back up camera. It was aero dynamic, light weight and fast for its day. The car was completed by 1938 and driven to Detroit where the big three turned it down. They thought they could not do the tooling necessary to put it into production and turn a profit. Several years later they all adopted many

of the Rocket Car's features. The car was driven up into the fifties by one of the original builders before being shut down. At one point the wife of one of the builders stalled it on the railroad tracks but fortunately she got it off before anything bad happened.

The car did belong to member Gary Alt who sold it a couple years ago to a couple of fellows who are having it restored. They plan on donating it to the city of Batavia. It is thought that it will eventually be on display at the Batavia Historical Society Museum. It needs your help.

The Sidelight looks like it will be our only means of communication for the foreseeable future, as we have cancelled most of our indoor activities through early next year. The Board will be meeting again on Tuesday November 10th to go over functions for early next year and the Board elections. If any member would like to throw their hat in the ring to run for the Board please let any Board member know by November 10th.

Also wondering, when was the first automobile accident? According to the websiteshttps://medium.com/@You Mean Business/the-fascinating-history-of-car-accidents-ac7478e0079e and https://www.autoevolution.com/news/150-

years-ago-the-first-fatal -car- crash- took-

place-in-ireland-137139.html it depends on the definition of automobile. Famous astronomer and naturalist Mary Ward, age 42, an Irish scientist, was the first recorded fatality when she fell out a steam powered (homemade) Rickets vehicle and was run over by it on Aug 13, 1869. She died of a broken neck. Jack Lambert, driving his gas powered buggy he invented, hit a tree root and crashed into a post in 1891. He and his passenger had minor injuries. The first pedestrian to be killed was in 1896 when Bridget Driscoll, of London, was so startled by the vehicle as she stepped off the curb that she froze in place. Arthur Edsall was only driving 4 miles an hour at the time. Bridget's death was ruled an accident

and the coroner said that he "hoped such a thing 'would never happen again". Henry Bliss was the first US fatality when he was hit by an electric taxi car and suffered a fatal head injury in 1899. 1896 a bicyclist suffered a broken leg when he was





hit by Henry Wells who was driving the first commercial auto sold in the US, a Duryea.

LAKE ERIE REGION DIY TOUR contest

There is still around a month to get those antique wheels out for a final couple of runs and while you're out, look for those letters. One submission has already been turned in, so it still can be done. Below are the rules to the "Create Your Own" tour. Since there is no November meeting, contact Valerie Wilson when your submission is ready to made arrangements to turn it in on or before November 30, 2020.

The primary idea is to visit towns throughout western New York where the first letter of the towns spells out LAKE ERIE REGION. For example, you can take a drive to Ellicottville, Rochester, Indian Falls, and East Aurora, and the first letter of those towns spells ERIE. And then maybe your next tour is to towns that spell LAKE (or part of LAKE), and so on. The whole tour can be spread out over the summer and fall.

There are a few rules for this contest:


- 1. Pictures are to be taken in locations decided by you.
- 2. You can use up to three different vehicles for the pictures.
- 3. The pictures have to have the sign from different towns with the vehicle in it. (Some towns don't have a town sign, so you may use a post office, town hall or fire station, etc.) You may substitute up to 4 street signs for a town sign.
- 4. You can use a town only once.
- 5. The vehicle has to be driven, not trailered to all the towns you use. Trailering a vehicle to a tour and then driving to the town is acceptable.
- 6. Your tour should be put together in a scrapbook that includes the town pictures, mileage driven, and any interesting occurrences and or problems encountered. Scrapbooks can be printed or digital (e.g. a power point presentation), depending on your preference.
- 7. You do not have to drive all the tour at once. You have until November to complete this.
- 8. Entries will be judged with consideration to the age of the vehicle, mileage driven to take the picture, and final scrapbook presentation, either paper or digital.
- 9. The contest will be judged by a panel of judges not entered in the contest.
- 10. All entries must be submitted by November 30, 2020 to be eligible for a prize.
- 11. There will be prizes awarded at the Installation Banquet or at the next scheduled meeting after that time.
- 12. All vehicles will have an equal chance.




