

October 17th is the date for our next event; a driving tour of notable local sites associated with the history of brewing and drinking beer, followed by a tour and meal at Hofbrauhaus Buffalo, 190 Scott Street.

To start the day, we will meet at Southgate Plaza (near Paula's Donuts) at 10:30 AM, and depart for the tour at 11:00 AM. On arrival at the Hofbrauhaus, there will be reserved parking in a fenced, attended lot adjacent to the beergarten. Tours of the brewing operation will begin thereafter, with our meal scheduled for 1:00.

You have a choice of three entrees; a sausage platter, a schnitzel, or a salad.

The Sausage Platter includes a Nurnberger (pork) and a Geflugal (chicken) Bratwurst with a side of homemade Bavarian style (served cold) German potato salad.

Schnitzel Wiener Art is classic breaded pork cutlet served crisp and golden brown, with cranberries and the homemade Bavarian style German potato salad.

Bayerische Salatplatte with Grilled Chicken Breast is a blend of seasonal greens and veggies, grilled chicken breast, and house made mustard vinaigrette.



Each meal includes Tagessupe (soup of the day), Black Forest Chocolate Mousse, and non-alcoholic beverage.

The bar will be open at noon and additional ala carte items (such as pretzels) can be purchased off the menu before, during or after the meal.







The 2021 Hemmings Motor News Great Race Experience by George and Ruth Camann

The Great Race is an annual event nine-day timed speed endurance rally race that started in 1983, inspired by the original 1908 New York to Paris Race. The 2021 Great Race began in San Antonio, TX and traveled through Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kentucky, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina and finished in Greenville, SC. The Great Race route had scheduled a lunch stop in Huntington, WV and an overnight stay in Beckley, WV on Friday June 25th. Ruth and I decided to take a road trip and join the local spectators at these two sites. The race was originally scheduled for June of 2020 but did not take place due to the pandemic.

The race was held this year following the same route planned for 2020. We drove 460 miles to Beckley on Thursday and stayed overnight in a pleasant Airbnb. Friday morning was warm and sunny, we drove 120 miles on Route I-64 through Charleston to Huntington in time to watch the race participants arrive around noon for their lunch break (and other necessary functions). I introduced myself to Carroll, the President of the Huntington Region AACA. (picture 1) He was quite busy greeting each team as they entered the parking area while the other AACA members were helping to direct the parking of the racers and keeping the many spectators clear of the parking areas. We stayed for a short time and headed back to Beckley. Meanwhile the route that the racers followed from Huntington to Beckley included many scenic back roads and a drive across the New River Gorge Bridge, the bridge is 3030 ft long and 876 ft high. We arrived in Beckley in time to see a color guard presentation while a local vocalist sang the National Anthem. (picture 2) As the racers pass through that day's finish line beginning around 5pm, the spectators are lined along the streets cheering for each team and the Great Race organizers announce the team members names, where they are from. along with the make, model, and year of their car.

It was a party atmosphere with much fanfare, food vendors, a classic car show and entertainment at a nearby community park in the downtown area that evening. The competitor's cars are parked on the local streets and the spectators have time to chat with drivers and navigators.

The Great Race usually has entrants from the US as well as Canada, England, Australia and Japan. Due to the pandemic travel restrictions, the entrants were all from the US this year. The race took place from June 19th to June 27th, for nine days and a journey of over 2,300 miles. There were more than 120 race teams entered this year and 87 teams finished the race. The vintage of the cars must be 1974 or older. The oldest cars were a 1916 Hudson Hillclimber (picture 3) and a 1916 Hudson

Speedster. There are five divisions: Grand Championship, Expert, Sportsman, X-Cup and Rookie.

The overall winner this year were sisters Olivia and Genna Gentry driving #65 Dixie Darlings in a 1932 Ford 5-Window Coupe. (picture 4) It was a historical finish because it was the first time an all-female team won and their final score of 41.31 seconds was very impressive. Their mother Beth Gentry and cousin Jody Knowles (2017 Grand Champions) were in second place in the #66 Pop's Passion 1932 Ford Cabriolet (picture 5). Third place were Gary and Jean Ann Martin in #38 Martin Vroom-Coker Tire 1932 Ford Coupe (picture 6). Fourth place were Richard and Doug Sharp (2011, 2015 & 2019 Grand Champions) in the #1 Restoration Supply Company 1916 Hudson Hillclimber (picture 3).

One of our favorite cars was the 88th place Team #30 The Wandering Troubadours of Finland (WTF?) in a chain drive 1918 American LaFrance Speedster, as they enter the end of each stage, they are accompanied by six teammates, each carrying the Finnish Flag running alongside the car, much to the delight of the spectators (picture 7). Another favorite is 59th place Team #46 Blues Brothers 1974 Plymouth Blues Mobile, the drivers are dressed as Jake and Elwood Blues playing oldies music through the giant speaker mounted on the roof and a manikin dressed as a nun in the back seat (picture 8). We also liked the 52nd place Team #49 Met-A-Bug 1961 Nash Metropolitan (picture 9). and the 77th place #117 Team Eisleben 1966 Shelby GT 350H, an actual car available for rent at the Hertz Car Rental Company located at the JFK Airport (picture 10). This car had to have its transmission replaced under warranty after 1,200 miles. I am partial to 51st place #94 Team Mangan 2 1965 Ford Fairlane since that was like my first car (picture 11). The nicest car we saw was 93rd place #89 Team Schneider 1937 Lagonda LG6, a medium blue convertible produced in England (picture 12).

We were impressed with the variety of cars that are entered each year. We are looking forward to next year when the 2022 Great Race will begin June 18th in Warwick, RI and end June 26th in Fargo, ND. I have been told by a very good authority (Jeff Mahl) that there will be stops in Binghamton, Wellsville, and Erie. For more information on the Great Race check out their website: www.greatrace.com

To complete our trip, we visited a vintage coal mine and museum in Beckley which included an underground tour into the mine on a coal car used by the miners on the original tracks with the tour led by a retired coal miner. The next day we toured two Frank Lloyd Wright designed homes, Fallingwater in Mill Run, PA and Kentuck Knob in Dunbar, PA and we also stopped at the Flight 93 National Memorial September 11, 2001, crash site in Stonycreek, PA. The Memorial was well

done and was a very emotional experience for us. We truly recommend stopping there if you have the opportunity.
