The Story of the Return of the Flying Yankee by George Camann

I had started working in the engineering department of Hooker Chemical in 1972 and Larry Gee (a longtime member of the AACA LER) was one of the first co-workers I met. We worked together on several projects in the Niagara Falls Plant. We became friends and did a lot

of "shooting the breeze" about our personal lives during lunch. Larry showed me his fantastic HO train layout in his basement, and I was very impressed. I could tell that he truly loved trains. But Larry wasn't happy with just an HO train layout. He wanted the BIG "O" Gauge Lionel trains! Larry was convinced that he would never have a collection of Lionel trains because all the other train collectors owned them. Well, I really felt sorry

for my buddy Larry. I wanted Larry to get started with that collection. I remembered that my Dad had an old train set in a box in the garage. As a child I was never allowed to play with it. My Dad said it didn't work. So, I asked him if he was willing to sell the train set to Larry. I figured my Dad would be happy to be rid of a non-working train set and Larry would be happy to begin his collection of Lionel

Trains. This train set happened to be a pre-war Lionel Flying Yankee Passenger Train that my Dad received around 1935 when he was 10 years old. Well Larry bought it and restored it to perfect running condition. Larry kept it on display for over 30 years and eventually built a

beautiful Lionel train layout in his basement and acquired many other train sets and accessories. If you have ever been in Larry's basement, you know that he owned one of the nicest collections of Lionel trains, at least the nicest in Sanborn! Every time I would visit Larry and see the train layout, I always noticed how nice that Flying Yankee looked and what a terrific job he did in restoring it. Larry ended up moving and dismantling his train layout and selling many of his Lionel trains. About five years ago I was very

surprised when Larry gave me the Yankee Flyer train set. He said he had always intended to return the train to me. I am so pleased and grateful to Larry to have this 85-year-old train operating under the Christmas Tree in our living room each year and the grandkids enjoy watching it run around the track and I get to play with it whenever I want.





Here are a couple of recipes for the holidays

We would like to wish you all a Merry Christmas and share one of our Christmas traditions with you. After baby Jesus is safely in the manger and the gifts have been opened, we share Mom Schwartz's Sour Cream Coffee Cake. We enjoy our time together before going to visit family.

Sour Cream Coffee Cake Recipe

1 stick butter 2 cups flour
1 cup sugar 1 tsp baking soda
2 eggs (1 at a time) 1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp vanilla 1/2 pint sour cream

Preheat oven to 350°

Cream butter, sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Add dry ingredients and mix well. Fold in sour cream.

Pour into greased tube pan cut in as in a marble cake: 1/3 cup sugar and 1 tsp cinnamon mixed together Sprinkle with chopped nuts Bake 35-40 min (until toothpick comes out clean) at 350° From Karen Schwartz





1 cup plus 1 tsp butter, softened and divided

1 pkg (8oz) cream cheese, softened

3 c. flour

4 c. ground walnuts

1 1/4 c. sugar

1/2 c. 2% milk

1 tsp Vanilla extract

1/8 tsp salt

In a large bowl, beat 1 cup butter and the cream cheese until light and fluffy. Gradually add flour, beating until mixture forms a ball. Divide dough into four portions; roll each into a 12 inch-circle.

Melt the remaining butter. In a large bowl,

combine the walnuts, 3/4 cup sugar, milk, vanilla, salt and melted butter. Spread over circles. Cut each into 12 wedges. Roll up wedges, starting from the wide ends. Place point side down on greased baking sheets. Curve ends to form crescents. bake at 325 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire racks. Place remaining sugar in a small shallow bowl. Roll warm cookies in the sugar.

Shedding light on the history of my candles

At our November event, we shared some of our treasures and memories from our childhood. One of mine was the small wax candle choir boys and girls that my Mom always had. These were bought for 10 and 15 cents at the dime store, and I still have some today. Cliff Shultz asked if I had any history on the candles, and I didn't at the time so decided to investigate. The company started in Buffalo in 1939 by Franklin Gurley's W&F Manufacturing Company, who was at first commissioned by Socony-Vacuum Oil Company (now ExxonMobil) as a way to reuse excess paraffin produced as a by-product of the oil refinery process. The first products were made under the name Tavern and offered a limited number of small candle figures primarily for the holidays such as pumpkins, pilgrims and Santa Claus. By the late 1940s the company's business was almost exclusively novelty

candles, and by 1949 the brand name was changed to the Gurley Novelty Company. Most candles had a round Gurley label attached to the bottom.

The candles were sold at a variety of stores in the area over several decades and sales continued to rise throughout the 1950s, peaking in the late 1960s. By the late 1970s the company was in decline. Today these figurines are very popular collectibles, especially the Halloween and Christmas ones. Their popularity has made them a hot item on eBay, where I have bought some to compliment my set. I have also found them at garage and estate sales. I love putting them on display at Christmas because they remind me of my early childhood Christmases with my family.


