

Zucchini Parmesan Foil Packets

1/4 cup butter, melted 1/4 cup grated Parmesan 1 tsp dried basil 1 tsp dried oregano salt and pepper to taste 4 zucchinis, cut into 1/4" thick rounds 1/4 tsp crushed red pepper

2 tbsp parsley




- 1. Whisk together butter, parmesan, basil, oregano, red pepper, parsley, and season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 2. Center zucchini on a sheet of Reynolds wrap heavy duty foil. Spoon butter mixture over zucchini. Bring up foil sides. Double fold top and ends to seal packet, leaving room for heat circulation inside.
- 3. Place foil packets on the grill and cook until just cooked through, about 15-20 minutes.
